Student Led Conferences

A few years ago, High School science teacher Alli Heneghan suggested that rather than continue with the traditional parent teacher conferences, where students have no involvement in evaluating their school performance, why not move to a model that is more in line with the mission and vision of our school: **Student Led Conferences**. In this model students present a portfolio of their work to their parent or guardian in the company of one of their teachers. The work ranges from things they are proud of or aced to work that they failed at. The student tells their parent/guardian what the difference is between these two assignments, why did they succeed on one and fail at the other? What was learned or gained in both cases? Reflecting on how the work was done and what came of that is integral in helping students discover themselves. This semester's **SLC** take place this **Friday, October 26**. Call Cathie to schedule your conference (High School students meet with their advisor. Middle School students meet with one of their teachers). Remember: **YCC and internships** will still run on Friday and students are *required* to have an SLC and must get themselves to and from the conference.
