Middle School

This is just the beginning

When you pull up to the curb to drop your dear one off, a smiling middle school staff person will be there to direct them to their grade level classroom. **6th graders** will go **to the portables** (behind the main building) with **Ms. Aversa**. **7th graders** will go to **Mr. Ramirez's room** (formerly known as Mr. Knight's room). And **8th graders** will go to **Ms. Chaney's room** (same as last year).

Because we are smaller...

we have *mini-villages* the first week. Your child needs to come prepared to be outside and to play in the dirt. The **BIG 5** is necessary and required: hat, closed toed shoes, lunch, two water bottles, journal and pencil (we will give them a journal). Here is our schedule for the first day. The rest of the week will probably go mostly like this, as well. We will adjust due to weather or because the direction of the groups requires it. That means we may be at the mini-village site for more or less time. **This is really important: If you need to pick your child up during the school day (doctor's appointment, for instance) you *must* go to the school *first* and fill out a form. Then come to the site to get your child.**

8:30-8:45.....Attendance in grade level classroom

8:45-9:00.....All School Circle (MS and HS!)

9:00-9:45.....Meet in grade level classroom. Get information about mini-villages.

9:45-10:30.....Walk to mini-village site behind Ben Altamirano field (accessed by the road before the new Sonic on Hwy 180)

10:30-10:45....Introductions and mini-village group assignments given

10:45-11:15....Find spaces

11:15-11:30....Debrief and wash hands

11:30-12:00....Lunch

12:00-1:00.....Back to work on villages

1:00 – 1:15.....Define Realms

1:15 – 2:00.....Walk back to school

2:00 – 3:40.....Work in rooms. Journal
