ALCS Lottery Dates for 2019-2020 School Year

As a public charter school we welcome all students. But they must apply to our school and put their name in a lottery. The following are the lottery application deadlines and drawings dates for the first two.

Remember: if you are the parent of a current Aldo student, and you have another child who wants to go here, they are given a spot, BUT you must apply in the first lottery.

Applications may be accepted beginning January 18, 2019

Lottery Dates:

February 15, 2019 at 1:00 pm (Friday)

Deadline for application: Thursday, February 14 by 4:00 pm

March 1, 2019 at 1:00 pm (Friday)

Deadline for application: Thursday, February 28 by 4:00 pm

Lottery results will be available by the following Monday. The Student Lottery Number you received when the Lottery Enrollment Form was turned in at the ALCS office will also be published on the ALCS website http://www.aldocs.org. Once you receive notification that your student has a seat at ALCS, please pick up and

complete the Registration Packet and the Health Information Packet as soon as possible.

Families must have the Registration Packet completed and returned to the school on or before the deadline of the next lottery. If this deadline is not met, the student's acceptance to ALCS will be waived and the family may re-submit a lottery application for the next available lottery.

community orientation class will only consist of the 9th graders. If you are not a 9th grader you will working with Guy Ramirez on YCC and internships.


